Monetary Donations

As a not-for-profit rescue organisation we rely heavily on community support to continue to rescue and rehabilitate Rats as well as educating the public about Rat nutrition, housing, caring, recognising illness and more.

We are continually reaching out to people via letter box drops, drop in visits to pet shops, providing information via the internet and printing out information sheets for those who request it.

To continue to provide these services we have to ask for donations, we wish we could do it on our own but the problem is far bigger than any one persons bank account.

Any monetary donations go directly to Perth Rat Rescue & Rehab and are used to help Rats that are surrendered to us, None of the funds are used for our own enjoyment or to pay anyone for helping us.
